County board vote creates funding shortfall

The Portage Library is among the Columbia County libraries adversely affected by a recent decision by the County Board of Supervisors to reduce its reimbursement for library services for county residents living in villages or townships without a library.

The past few years, that reimbursement has covered 80% of for each circulation. This year, the reimbursement rate is 74%. For the Portage Library, that means an unexpected shortfall of \$12,000.

According to Library Director Jessica Bergin, that money would have been spent to replace a number of aging computers, and to acquire new materials to supplement materials in special collections. She urged concerned patrons to contact their county supervisors regarding the importance of this subsidy. "Show them you value our libraries!" she said.

All Things Teen & Tech

The Portage Library video game collection now offers over 170 games, and the library continues to purchase some of the biggest games being released each month. According to Teen Services and Technology Coordinator Chris Baker, the games can be put on hold through LINKcat. "Our collection of video games rivals, and in some cases surpasses, that of larger libraries in the system." The collection shows that "we are trying to stay fresh, relevant, and on top of new technology and community interest." Chris is a lifelong gamer who strives to offer a diverse collection of genres, content, age range and more.

Attendance at teen programs at the library this fall has been high, with card and board game nights, movie nights, and crafts like origami. Chris says there will soon be consistent "Anime Nights," including Japanese snacks. Contact him at cbaker@portagelibrary.us to learn more

'No Fines' for overdue materials for children starts in January

Beginning in January, the Portage Library will no longer charge children (from birth through 5th grade) with fines for overdue materials from Portage collections. This Fine Free for the Future program is a national initiative designed to encourage literacy.

The new policy recognizes the need of children regardless of socio-economic background to have access to early literacy materials. Rather than levying fines that might create a barrier for access, the library wants to encourage patrons to use collections and services. Library Director Jessica Bergin notes that the budgetary impact on the library will be minimal Studies show that the new policy will likely result in an increase in circulation.

Even at a nickel/day for each book, DVD, etc., fines can become prohibitive for low-income families. In just a week, such a family with eight children's movies, 10 picture books, and three audiobooks overdue would accrue a debt of \$7. The new policy removes such short-term charges.

Overdue notices will still be sent on children's items. Once an item becomes 29 days overdue, it is marked lost and the patron is billed. When more than \$19.99 in overdue or lost charges accumulates, the patron cannot check out materials until the debt is resolved. This aligns with charges by vendors as Netflix, when service resumes once an item is returned.

The Wisconsin Association of Public Libraries promotes the Fine Free for the Future program because it minimizes negative, punitive experiences and encourages children to use library materials.

New resources help those with memory issues

BiFOLKal kits to help facilitate group discussion on participants' past experiences are now available at the library.. The CDs and print materials help individuals generate memories on a specific theme, such as "Remembering:" "Remembering the "Remembering Pets," and "Remembering Spring

These resources are particularly effective tools to reach people with memory issues. Portage is now the holding site for the South Central Library System's collection of several dozen BiFOLKal kits. Each binder may be checked out for a month at a time.
