Annual meeting an event for all Friends

A presentation about the enduring popularity of Laura Ingalls Wilder and her "Little House" series of children's books will be featured at the Friends of the Library annual meeting on Oct. 12. Dr. Anna Hajdik, a lecturer in the English Department and Film Studies program at UW-Whitewater will guide her listeners to view the series through the lens of tourism and popular culture with "Dreams of the Prairie: Laura Ingalls Wilder, Authenticity, and Literary Tourism in the American Midwest."



From touring the Surveyor's House or spending the night in a covered wagon at the Ingalls Homestead in De Smet, South Dakota, to participating in a Laura Ingalls Wilder look-a-like contest in Walnut Grove or Pepin, Dr. Hajdik contends that Wilder-related tourism is linked indelibly to the search for authenticity and a nostalgic vision of America's pioneer heritage. Dr. Hajdik earned her Ph.D. in American Studies from the University of Texas at Austin and her undergraduate degree in History and Film Studies from Macalester College. Her research on Laura Ingalls Wilder was conducted while on fellowship at the Center for Rural and Regional Studies at Southwest State University in Marshall, Minnesota. The event will be in the Bidwell Room at the library. Light refreshments will be served starting at 6:30, with the brief annual meeting starting at 6:45, followed by the program at 7. All members of Friends of the Library are invited to attend this gathering.

New director sees strengths & challenges ahead

As she approached the two-month anniversary of her new job as director the Portage Library, Jessica Bergin paid compliments to the Portage community for providing the financial support to complete the library expansion, and ongoing support as evidenced by donations and memorial books given to the library. She is equally impressed with the quality of the library staff — "they are so-o-o-o good!" — and the "top notch facility." The library is especially impressive for the size of the community, she notes, and feels that with time "we can do just about anything!"



One of the challenges she sees is using the staff to its full potential. For instance, Amanda Pardo, recently the circulation supervisor, is now the teen and technology services coordinator, creating programs and activities for teens and tending to the

library's website, social media, and the public computers. Adult programming and services will be handled by Lynn Harthorne (who served as interim director before Jessica arrived) and additional vacant staff positions are currently posted.

Jessica intends to work hard to develop partnerships with other organizations, such as the schools, Portage Center for the Arts, and other community groups. Strong partnerships will ultimately have beneficial results for all involved, she maintains.

There's plenty of work for the new director — who also has a husband and children — but when she has time for recreational reading she likes books of the "cozy mystery" genre (e.g. books by author M.C. Beaton). She's also a fan of Charlaine Harris, author of the Sookie Stackhouse series, upon which was based HBO's *True Blood* series.

Did you know ...?

In the past five years Friends of the Library has contributed \$25,900 to the library. This does not include the \$2,500 pledge to the capital campaign for library expansion, and which was paid off one year early.

Portage Library to host 'Go Big Read' discussion

The Portage Library will follow the lead of Madison Public Library who partners yearly with University of Wisconsin-Madison for "Go Big Read." This year's selection is *Evicted* by Matthew Desmond. The discussion will be Tuesday, Nov.

15 at 6:30. Two students from the School of Library and Information Science will be facilitating the discussion. Books will be available on a first-come basis at the library starting Oct. 19. Book sale big \$Success

Year-round planning and organizing paid off well for the Friends of the Library book sale in late July with receipts totaling \$5,335. The annual book sale is the primary fundraising activity for the organization. According to Marvin Jensen, book sale committee chair, the sale "appears to be drawing patrons from a widening area, due in part to publicity in surrounding communities, invitations to dealers, and information targeted to visitors to Portage, such as this year's Edsel convention attendees." He adds that "scheduling the sale before the county fair seemed to work well—even in the face of road construction in front of the library, a gas leak, a major storm, and shortened library hours." Next year's sale is scheduled for July 20-22 (with member's preview night on July 19). Donations for the next sale are now being accepted at the library. Arrangements for pick-up of books can be made by calling 742-7783. Over 75 volunteers helped before, during, and after the sale; 19 volunteers helped at the sorts throughout the year. **The first monthly book sort for the 2017 sale will be Sept. 9, from 9-11 am, in the Bidwell Room.**
