

The Columbia County Library System Board recently selected Marvin Jensen of Portage to receive an award as Library Advocate of the Year for 2017. Jensen, who's served on the Board of the Friends of the Portage Library for more than a decade, was commended for his leadership and service. Jensen is also credited as the advocate of interlibrary partnerships with such area libraries as Pardeeville and Wyocena to promote the exchange of ideas. Specifically, as chair of the annual book sale sponsored by the Portage Friends each July, Jensen has spearheaded efforts resulting in steadily increasing receipts. As a consequence, the Friends' support of library programs has expanded significantly.

Genealogy guru provides help to many

Searching for information about the death of your ancestors from Columbia County, WI? You can begin your search in the Sanderson Room at the library. Binders there contain information on all burials on record in Columbia County cemeteries, as well as on details from obituaries from Portage newspapers from 1850 on.

For further help, Portage Library staff may direct your questions to local volunteer Anna Mae Axness. Beginning 15 years ago, Axness spearheaded the effort to gather local geneological information. She's developed an Excel 2010 file with more than 80,000 entries from Columbia County cemeterie. Names of the deceased are organized first by city/village/township, then by cemetery, then alphabetically. Local IT professional Josh Ciolosz created a link making the file accessible through the Museum at the Portage Website (portagemuseum.org).

Considering the extensive project, Axness credits numerous volunteers such as Char Sauer, presently of Franklin and formerly of Fall River, for going through microfiche records of newspapers from 1850 on. Numerous other volunteers, including students from Portage's River Crossing School, went on foot into each of the county cemeteries in order to document information and photograph headstones.
